

Chicks

	<p>White Jumbo Cornish Rock Cross-Broilers: For tender, tasty, better-flavored meat, raise your own chicks! In just 7 weeks, you'll have a nutritious 3 ½ to 4lb. dressed bird. For best results, feed Kalmbach Feed's 22% broiler ration.</p>
	<p>White Rocks: Named after the pilgrims that first landed in America, this fast-maturing, heavy-bodied pullets assure you top production of large, brown premium grade eggs. This breed has a long life expectancy. When the laying cycle is over, you'll enjoy quality meat at low cost.</p>
	<p>New Hampshires: A great red feathered chicken closely related to the Rhode Island Red, bred for early maturity and quiet disposition. This dual purpose bird has choice meat qualities and high brown egg production. Very tolerant to colder weather.</p>
	<p>Barred Rocks: The good "Old Fashioned" black and white chicken. You'll get top egg production from this beautiful bird. Great temperament and does well in colder weather. Customers rate this bird as a real egg layer.</p>
	<p>Barred Cross Sex-Links: Outstanding layers with hybrid vigor. This dual purpose bird will give you both meat and egg production. Pullets are black, cockerels are barred color.</p>
	<p>Rhode Island Reds: If you are striving for a heavy bird with great brown egg productions possibilities, this "Red" is it. They hold their popularity nicely as a dual purpose fowl, egg production efficiency together with improved livability.</p>
	<p>Buff Orpingtons: Hens will produce high quality eggs in good quantities. Coloring is yellow orange. Quiet temperament, friendly disposition and good around kids. Excellent setters, and good maternal instinct. This dual purpose bird will not disappoint!</p>
	<p>Golden Comets: The Golden Comet is one of the very successful varieties of high production brown egg layers. They are fast to mature and start laying at a younger age than most chickens. Ideal large brown egg layers for any backyard or farm!</p>
	<p>Silver-Laced Wyandottes: Named after the Native American tribe "Wyandot", this large picturesque chicken with a unique feather pattern readily distinguish them as an outstanding flock. This dual purpose breed is docile and is a good brown egg producer on pasture and/or free range.</p>
	<p>Araucanas: Lay nice sized colored eggs, often called "Easter Eggs". These birds vary in size and color, some may have whiskers and others have feathers that cover their ears. They provide great nutritional value.</p>

Pheasants

Turkeys

	<p>Nicholas Large Broad Breasted Bronze Turkey: Broad- Breasted Bronze turkeys are fast growing turkeys that produce ample amounts of meat. The feathers of the Broad- Breasted Bronze are dark similar to wild turkeys with a metallic sheen and a whitish edging on the tail feathers. They are a very popular variety of turkeys for the small farm flock.</p>

Ducklings

The male is especially colorful, having a deep lustrous green head and upper neck, while the back is gray mixed with green. The female is barred on the wings with brown body color and penciling in all sections.</p>
	<p>Ridgway Mallards: Mallards are an excellent game bird and they are popular with sportsmen. Many a "disappointed" sportsman will pay a good price for genuine Mallards. Their coloring is brilliant and they provide a delicious delicacy for special dinner occasions. Mallards fly, but will stay at home if fed regularly. Trainers will use these game birds to train their dogs. Pinioning will not remove their wild quality.</p>
	<p>Ridgway Colored Indian Runner: Indian Runners are a good breed for the home duck flock, being ornamental and highly entertaining. Egg production averages 275 to 340 eggs per hen. Indian Runners are unique and practical with their upright posture, fast gate, and good laying quality.</p>
	<p>Ridgway Blue Swedish: Gray-blue in color with white bibs. Extremely hardy due to being bred in northern England and an active forager. People interested will be intrigued by this breed. Outstanding egg layer, they will produce eggs year round.</p>

Guineas

	<p>French Guineas: French Guinea breeders have for many generations, intently selected this variety for rapid growth and for year round production of eggs. French Guineas, when fed a high energy, high protein ration similar to broiler feed, will weigh in excess of 4 pounds at 13 weeks of age. They will lay throughout the year. Some of the benefits of having a farm flock of guineas are as follows: very fine "watch dogs", keep snakes away from the farm and consume grasshoppers, ticks and other insects.</p>
